International Worker Update

The relief team in Indonesia is still going strong, assisting other CAMA workers and those living in the flooded areas. Because they had access to a four-wheel drive vehicle, they were able to venture to inaccessible areas, and found many who were without water and in need of help. Because of prayers and giving back, they have been able to clean out mud and charred roofing, provide household items and building supplies, and give hope to 13+ widows in the area.

In France, as you probably already know, a fire broke out in the Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris. The following are excerpts from one international worker serving in that area:

"...As the ashes of the old church settled, so did the Parisians. As life continued, people walked around stunned. There was a subtle, silent recognition of what we were going through together. Underneath it all, people anxiously awaited news of the church's fate.

That day, a picture began rapidly circulating of the inside of Notre Dame. It showed that the cross on the alter still stood. People around the world took this as a sign—the cross still stands among the ashes. As interior images appeared, we began to hear one word over and over—hope....

I believe somehow all of this is causing people to look deep—to search their roots, history, and identity. They seem to be collectively tapping into something simultaneously ancient and new. Physically, emotionally, and even spiritually there is a stirring in the heart of France.

Pray with us that the French people will wrestle with this deep stirring and ask the hard questions so they all will see that God is more than buildings, services, rules, and rigidness. Our resurrected Lord is our greatest hope. Only Jesus can rescue and restore their hearts, bringing new life. May this be the beginning of a great movement of the Holy Spirit here in France..."

Points of Prayer

- Keep single mothers in Burkina Faso in your prayers, especially those without anyone to help them care for their new children
- Continue to pray for Indonesia and its recovery from the devastating flooding still causing difficulty for those living in the area

The National Project

For the 2018-2019 year, the Great Commission Women are asking for MORE. Our local chapter here at the Crossroads Community Church is interpreting this by asking for more *for* the women of the church and more *from* the women of the church.

A huge part of this push around the country is called the National Project. This fundraiser is asking for *more* in five new projects around the globe:

- Silver Lining Orphanage * Asia/Pacific * \$31,500 Orphans find safety and security in a children's home that provides a loving, parented family structure. Local seminary students help lead this ministry.
- Women's Ministry Center * Mexico * \$31,500 Hurting and overlooked women receive spiritual guidance, legal and financial counsel, and 48-hour crisis-care intervention at the Circle of Care Women's Ministry Center.
- Santidougou Widows Center * Burkina Faso * \$31,500 Young, deaf
 women receive sewing machines and training, and widows are given
 access to soap-making equipment and a moringa press at the
 Santidougou Widows Center. Daughters of the widows receive oneyear scholarships to complete high school.
- CAMA Orphan Project * Vietnam * \$31,500 Single mothers are resourced to begin small, income-generating activities. Orphans receive tuition, school supplies, and monthly rice portions.
- Crisis Pregnancy Shelter * North & Central Asia * \$31,500 At risk
 migrant moms in crisis situations will receive temporary residence,
 practical support, counseling, and mentoring in life and mothering
 skills through the ministry of the shelter.
