## Me and More

Starting the year off as the newest leader of the Great Commission Women, I knew that whatever I challenged the other women in our group to do, I had to do, too. It would not be fair to challenge others to grow and not embark on that journey myself.

When I challenged the ladies at our January meeting to find an area of growth that they would work on for the year, I most assuredly *did not* want to pick one for myself. I am an all-or-nothing person, and I follow an all-or-nothing God, which makes things like setting growth goals extremely intimidating – it’s all or nothing. Period. So, after much debating and denying and trying to pretend it wasn’t so, I knew my call for growth for the year would be in the form of, “COURAGE.”

My challenge to the ladies had been to pick a personal growth area, work on it for the year, and find specific ways to make that growth happen. Regular time in prayer, talking with God, reading His word, being open to the Holy Spirit, and many other things were given as beginning steps. For me, I knew I needed make even *more specific* strides towards this courage I had decided to achieve. This unfortunately meant that I would need to put myself in situations where I would have to be brave.

The best way to build a muscle is to exercise it.

I shouldn’t *still* be surprised when God lines things up at the right time to give me crucial growth experiences. But I am. Every. Single. Time. To give you a snippet – since I declared I would work on being courageous through God, I have:

- Organized and participated in a trip to a laundromat where I had to talk to complete strangers
- Lead monthly meetings where I have to talk *in front of people*.
- Had many opportunities to pray *in front of people*
- Been invited to help train others for addictions support groups, both at church and at work
- Had several opportunities to talk about my faith at work with coworkers.

It still feels too early to talk about how it has all affected me, especially since some of these things haven’t come to fruition yet, BUT I do want to encourage you. If you have the guts to ask God where you need to grow, He’ll answer. He’ll help. He’ll guide you. So This is where I leave you. Ask yourself:

1. What area in your life would you like to see growth?
2. How can you work towards making that growth a reality?
3. Which path should you focus on – alone time, or time with others?
