International Worker Updates

Great Commission Day has recently passed, and the highlighted story for this year comes from cmalliance.org:

“After a nightmarish childhood and early adulthood, Emmanuelle felt compelled to end her life. In desperation, she cried out to a God she really didn’t know. He guided her to international worker Terri Althaus, who invited her to attend the Alliance church in Bordeaux.

Through Terri’s loving discipleship and the Holy Spirit’s transforming power, Emmanuelle was able to break the generational cycle of sin and brokenness. She is now a bright new light in France, seizing every opportunity to share the love of Jesus with her family and friends.”

If you’ve been following along the National Project set by the GCW leaders,

you might know the story of Ngoc (name changed), who contracted HIV during childbirth, who has recently come under the care of CAMA staff when her family is unable to care for her. Of the staff, she says, “I thank them for loving me, giving me a lot of hugs, praying for my and my mother’s health, and financially supporting me so I am able to continue school and have food to eat monthly.”

Other International workers are seeing success in their nations, too. If you haven’t already heard, more than 6 million people worship in Alliance churches throughout the world, and 82% of those Alliance workers live and serve among the least-reached populations in the world.
