International Worker Updates

An international worker stations in the East is preparing to speak at some special meetings on September 23 – 24th. The result of this speaking engagement has the potential to change lives. In the same area, another worker is preaching in multiple churches each month and is attempting to maintain strong relationships with their congregations while still maintaining a peace of mind. From the same region, a worker family is ministering at a college in the U.S. during their home assignment, and are hoping that their presence will have a lasting spiritual impact on the students. They are also adjusting to a newborn.

In Europe and the Middle East, nearly 40 pastors and ministry leaders from Croatia, Montenegro, and Bosnia-Herzegovina attended a counseling seminar, and are currently applying what they've learned with counseling ministries throughout the Balkans, hoping to bring healing and reconciliation to many communities in

the area. Also in the Middle East, there are a record number of students in a faith-based school that hosts both online and in-class teachings. Many partnerships have risen between the C&MA and other local churches and missions in these countries.



Points of Prayer:

- Areas affected by Hurricane Florence; that the rains will cease and the flooding will subside, and for successful rescue efforts of those who may still be trapped by flood waters.
- Keep the Philippines, Hong Kong, and China in our prayers as their lives have been recently devastated by Typhoon Mangkut. Keep in your prayers the C&MA efforts to assist and relief damaged areas.
- Continue to pray for creative access countries all over the world, for intercession and leadership to rise, and for comfort and encouragement for those working fervently in their designated areas.

For the 2017-2018 year, the Great Commission Women are asking for MORE. More for the women of the church and more from the women of the church.

A part of this push, The National Project, is asking for more help and involvement in four areas: at-risk girls in West Africa, pregnant teens in Ecuador, human trafficking survivors in Cambodia, and female prisoners in the Philippines.
